OUR STUDENTS

Total Enrollment: Grades 6-12: 241 Class of 2024: 40

- 99 % of our seniors accepted to 4 yr. colleges/universities
- Over 90% of our students graduate from college in 5 years
- 13% of our student body are international students
- 22% Asian, 33% White, 22% Black, 16% Hispanic, 7% Multi-ethnic
- 49% of students are male
- 51% of students are female
- Approximately 40% of our students speak another language other than English
- Over 70% of our students receive some form of financial aid

OUR COVID-19 RESPONSE

At Boston Trinity Academy, we firmly believe that integrating spiritual, academic, and physical health and well-being are essential components of our students' success. This year, our school day begins at 8:20 am, and academic instruction ends at 2:50 pm. All of our students are required to participate in at least one season of a sport each year. Each sports team meets every other day for practice from 3:45 to 5:30 pm.

We are in person this year for all class instruction. Adjustments were made at the end of the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 academic year.

Only semester and year grades are recorded on the transcript and the grade point average is calculated in December and June of each year.

Senior Honors Symposium is a required capstone course of the entire Boston Trinity Academy curriculum. In this interdisciplinary course, students draw on educational experiences for the whole of their Boston Trinity career to develop a project rooted in an academic discipline yet focused on a question of justice. As an end product of this course, students complete a 25-page research and analysis paper accompanied by an oral presentation on their findings. Students present orally before a panel of judges invited to Boston Trinity from various colleges and professional institutions around Boston.
